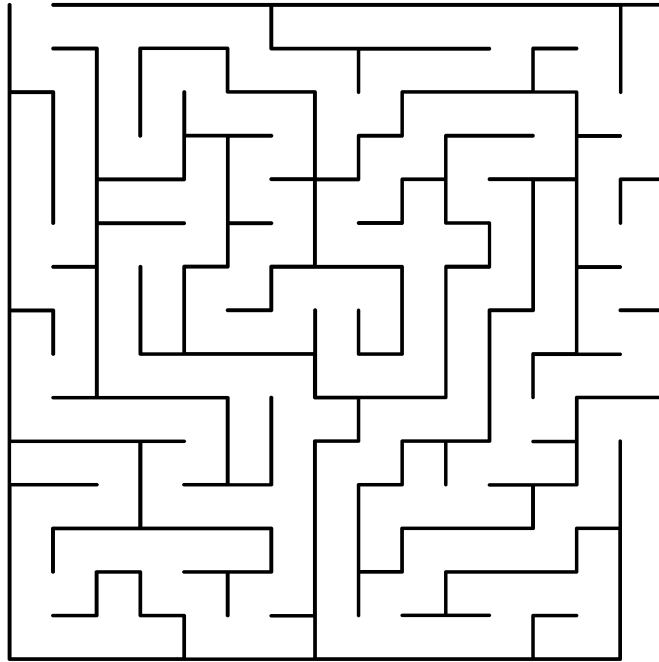




It's been a long, fun day at the beach, but I'm hungry for ice cream!

High Tide Approaching!

If you spent a whole day at the ocean, you'd probably notice that the water was moving slowly up onto the beach so the sandy beach got smaller, then moving slowly back off the beach making the sandy beach bigger again. That's the TIDE.

TIDES happen because the Moon pulls the water on Earth toward it, like a magnet.. HIGH TIDE moves the water higher. At LOW TIDE, the water goes out and the beach gets smaller again.

TIDE or TIED?

The words **TIED** and **TIDE** sound the same but have different meanings.

TIED means you used a rope or string to hold two things together, like if you **TIED** a balloon to a chair. (It's the past tense of the verb (or action word), "to Tie.")

The other **TIDE** is the word we use for when the ocean water slowly moves up and covers more of the beach, and then goes back down again. This happens every day!

Circle the correct word, **TIED** or **TIDE**, for each sentence below!

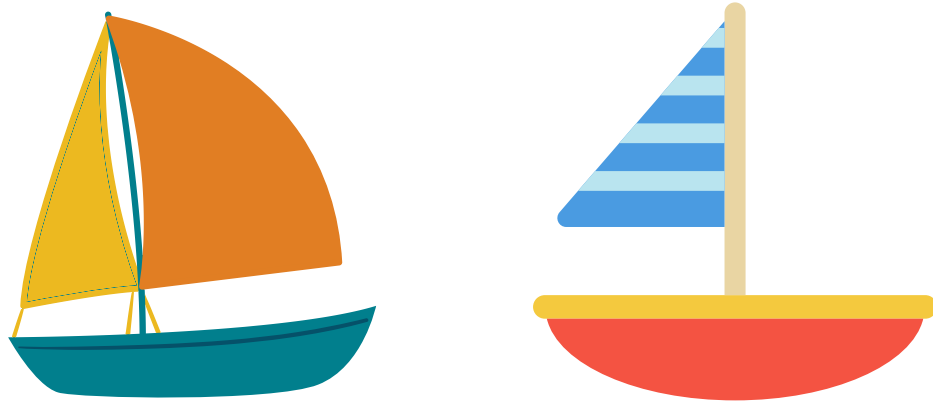
- Simon **TIED** , **TIDE** his dog to the railing while he ran into the store to tell his brother to hurry up!

SIMILAR

SIMILAR describes things that are close to being the same, but not exactly the same.

Sailboats all look kind of the same and can be used in the same way, but they are not exactly the same, they are **SIMILAR**.



These sailboats are SIMILAR, but not the exact same.
